Team-building, collaboration, and shared vision


Use the collaboration/project management tools such as [OneDrive](#), [SharePoint](#), [Trello](#), [Teams](#), [Asana](#) or [Slack](#), to keep remote workers in the loop.

Take extra care when writing emails and messages. Written business communications are notoriously poor at conveying tone. Make sure that messages sound positive – you can even use emojis (if that's your thing) to make your tone clear.

Schedule online team-building events to help people bond during isolation – communal lunches, coffee or drinks; live yoga/gym/singing classes; or even a collective Netflix binge.

Watch out for: phishing, Business Email Compromise, and cloud-based.

Loneliness


Build remote working into your Health and Safety policy and address the risk of loneliness before it becomes a problem.

Offer perks such as subscriptions for online gym classes or meditation apps.

Allow your employees a degree of autonomy and flexibility around time management. Insisting that your employees are available with a strict timeframe is clearly essential for some roles. However, the current situation means that you'll need to build in a higher degree of flexibility. Your goal is to make sure people are able to get the work done – if your staff find it easier to work later at night, earlier in the morning, or at weekends, so be it.

Watch out for: threats attempting to penetrate the corporate perimeter from external websites.

Keeping staff on track


Set clear expectations, so that staff are motivated to deliver projects on time.

Watch out for: employees facing the temptation to use unauthorized services on work devices, or BYOD devices hooked up to the corporate network remotely.
