## Component Shortages Persist

omponent shortages eased but remained high in December in categories such as processors, motherboards and memory while intensifying in areas such as network interface cards and video graphics cards, according to *CRN*'s monthly solution provider poll.

In prior months, *CRN* cited data showing worsening supply problems in processors and motherboards. These shortages, which in November had reached some of their highest levels since *CRN* began collecting data, eased in December but remained high by historical standards. For example, 34 percent of custom system builders reported moderate to severe microprocessor shortages last month, down from 39 percent in November but nearly double the 19 percent figure in December 2004. The results were similar for motherboards and memory.

In contrast, video graphics cards and network interface cards saw shortages increase for the second straight month. The percentage of custom system builders reporting severe shortages in these categories nearly doubled in December vs. November and was much higher than year-earlier levels. A similar trend was seen in hard drives, where the percentage of custom systems builders reporting severe shortages has jumped from two percent to nine percent in the past year.

CRN has previously indicated that rising component shortages would eventually have a negative impact on the competitiveness of custom PC hardware systems against branded systems. Exclusive CRN research data cited in the December CRN Research Report showed a dramatic decline in the percentage of solution providers citing white boxes as their best-selling desktops, notebooks and servers.

*CRN* research has also shown that component availability is a key factor behind the decision among solution providers whether to begin (or end) building custom systems. Data from December show that the downward trend in component availability over the past few months is now reducing sales of custom systems.

The percentage of solution providers building their desktops, notebooks and servers dropped sharply in December, to their lowest levels in more than year. For example, 45 percent of solution providers said they were building custom desktops in December, down from 55 percent in November and 58 percent in December 2004.
